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RESOLUTION 2024-07

THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION RESOLUTION OF THE HARMONY WEST COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT ("DISTRICT") RELATING TO THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS AND ADOPTING THE BUDGET(S) FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2024, AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2025; AUTHORIZING BUDGET AMENDMENTS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the District Manager has, prior to the fifteenth (15th) day in June, 2024, submitted to the Board of Supervisors ("Board") of the Harmony West Community Development District ("District") proposed budget(s) ("Proposed Budget") for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2024 and ending September 30, 2025 ("Fiscal Year 2024/2025") along with an explanatory and complete financial plan for each fund of the District, pursuant to the provisions of Section 190.008(2)(a), Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, at least sixty (60) days prior to the adoption of the Proposed Budget, the District filed a copy of the Proposed Budget with the local governing authorities having jurisdiction over the area included in the District pursuant to the provisions of Section 190.008(2)(b), Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the Board set a public hearing thereon and caused notice of such public hearing to be given by publication pursuant to Section 190.008(2)(a), Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the District Manager posted the Proposed Budget on the District's website at least two days before the public hearing; and

WHEREAS, Section 190.008(2)(a), Florida Statutes, requires that, prior to October 1st of each year, the Board, by passage of the Annual Appropriation Resolution, shall adopt a budget for the ensuing fiscal year and appropriate such sums of money as the Board deems necessary to defray all expenditures of the District during the ensuing fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the District Manager has prepared a Proposed Budget, whereby the budget shall project the cash receipts and disbursements anticipated during a given time period, including reserves for contingencies for emergency or other unanticipated expenditures during the fiscal year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE HARMONY WEST COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

SECTION 1. BUDGET

a. The Board has reviewed the Proposed Budget, a copy of which is on file with the office of the District Manager and at the District's Local Records Office, and hereby approves certain amendments thereto, as shown in Section 2 below.

- b. The Proposed Budget, attached hereto as **Exhibit "A,"** as amended by the Board, is hereby adopted in accordance with the provisions of Section 190.008(2)(a), *Florida Statutes* ("**Adopted Budget"**), and incorporated herein by reference; provided, however, that the comparative figures contained in the Adopted Budget may be subsequently revised as deemed necessary by the District Manager to reflect actual revenues and expenditures.
- c. The Adopted Budget shall be posted by the District Manager on the District's official website within thirty (30) days after adoption, and shall remain on the website for at least 2 years.

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATIONS

There is hereby appropriated out of the revenues of the District, for Fiscal Year 2024/2025, the sums set forth in **Exhibit A** to be raised by the levy of assessments, a funding agreement and/or otherwise. Such sums are deemed by the Board to be necessary to defray all expenditures of the District during said budget year, and are to be divided and appropriated in the amounts set forth in **Exhibit A**.

SECTION 3. BUDGET AMENDMENTS

Pursuant to Section 189.016, *Florida Statutes*, the District at any time within Fiscal Year 2024/2025 or within 60 days following the end of the Fiscal Year 2024/2025 may amend its Adopted Budget for that fiscal year as follows:

- a. A line-item appropriation for expenditures within a fund may be decreased or increased by motion of the Board recorded in the minutes, and approving the expenditure, if the total appropriations of the fund do not increase.
- b. The District Manager or Treasurer may approve an expenditure that would increase or decrease a line-item appropriation for expenditures within a fund if the total appropriations of the fund do not increase and if either (i) the aggregate change in the original appropriation item does not exceed the greater of \$15,000 or 15% of the original appropriation, or (ii) such expenditure is authorized by separate disbursement or spending resolution.
- c. Any other budget amendments shall be adopted by resolution and consistent with Florida law.

The District Manager or Treasurer must ensure that any amendments to the budget under paragraph c. above are posted on the District's website within 5 days after adoption and remain on the website for at least 2 years.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

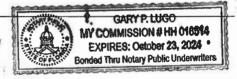

Upcoming Public Hearings, and Regular Meeting

The Board of Supervisors ("Board") for the Harmony West Community Development District ("District") will hold the following two public hearings and a regular meeting on July 18, 2024 at 10:30 a.m., or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard, and at Johnston's Surveying, Inc., 900 Cross Prairie Parkway, Kissimmee, Florida 34744.

The first public hearing is being held pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, to receive public comment and objections on the District's proposed budget ("Proposed Budget") for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2024 and ending September 30, 2025 ("Fiscal Year 2024/2025"). The second public hearing is being held pursuant to Chapters 190, 197, and/or 170, Florida Statutes, to consider the imposition of operations and maintenance special assessments ("O&M Assessments") upon the lands located within the District, to fund the Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2024/2025; to consider the adoption of an assessment roll; and, to provide for the levy, collection, and enforcement of assessments. At the conclusion of the hearings, the Board will, by resolution, adopt a budget and levy O&M Assessments as finally approved by the Board. A Board meeting of the District will also be held where the Board may consider any other District business.

Description of Assessments

The District imposes O&M Assessments on benefitted property within the District for the purpose of funding the District's general administrative, operations, and maintenance budget. A geographic depiction of the property potentially subject to the proposed O&M Assessments is identified in the map attached hereto. The table below shows the schedule of the proposed O&M Assessments, which are subject to change at the hearing:

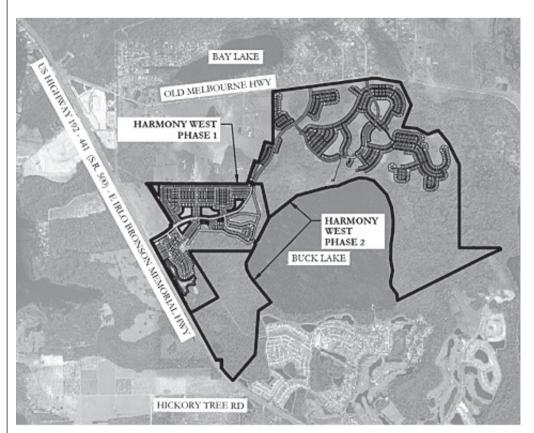
The O&M Assessments may be collected on the County tax roll or by direct bill from the District's Manager. Note that the O&M Assessments are in addition to any debt service assessments, if any, previously levied by the District and due to be collected for Fiscal Year 2024/2025. The law, which goes into effect July 1, provides processes for mediation between residents and owners. Stark said this is a shortened version [of mediation], where homeowners can file a petition to mediate and can pick their own mediator, if they want.

"Sometimes when you're noticed what your rent is going to be, sometimes it takes a long time if you're not going through a proper process or they drag their feet or whatever, either side. Then sometimes your rent increases before you even have

the conversation. So, this kind of circumvents that a little bit and gives you a little more power to take care of that," she said.

those people to be with those residents to help take care of them through the last stages of their life. And so now they

The new law also ensures that live-in health care aides can have ingress and egress to and from the mobile home owner's site without additional charges.

"So many of our local parks have seniors in them," Stark said. "Some of them, they're in their last years, and their health is failing. With their health failing, they need live-in aides. Previously we had parks who were charging extra for those people to be with those residents to help take care of them through the last stages of their life. And so now they can no longer do that. It also protects the park owners, because [the aides] don't have a right of tenancy once something happens to that resident."

Stark said there are still issues to address on behalf of mobile home residents, but this is a good start.

"Now we have a floor," she said. "And with that being on the floor, you have more power to talk about the other issues."

Sour on Spoilers

There are currently third-party candidates for president — Robert F. Kennedy Jr., Jill Stein and Cornell West. All three claim they are running to give voters a choice and a chance to voice their views. All three insist they are not "spoilers." Let's examine this.

In the last century, the most successful third party candidate was Ross Perot, with less than 19% of the popular vote in 1992. Voting third party is a "choice" to vote for someone who will not win. However, Teddy Roosevelt helped Woodrow Wilson defeat William Taft in 2012 and Ralph Nader helped George W. Bush defeat Al Gore in 2000. They were "spoilers." Polls indicate the Biden-Trump race may be close enough to allow a "spoiler" to decide the election.

The best way to create choice is to promote a voting system such as ranked choice voting, approval voting, or star voting.

They all allow voters to vote for whom they like without fear of the "spoiler" effect and each of those methods increase the chance of a third party victory because they each remove the fear of voting one's conscience.

For example, if you like Cornell West more than any other candidate, and if your state chose to switch to ranked choice voting for elections (it is already happening in some states), you can vote for Dr. West as your first choice without considering him a spoiler because you also get to choose one of the two major party candidates as your number two choice. Then, if no one gets "50% plus one" and your first choice candidate actually comes in third, your second choice goes to an "instant runoff" and you have both voted with your conscience and your "realpolitik" power. You have not wasted your vote; you have not enabled

the victory of someone you are horrified to see win.

That system especially favors "down ballot" chances for electing, for example, an independent House or Senate member.

The best ways to use your "voice" include letters to the editor, letters to candidates and elected officials, social media posts, peaceful demonstrations and thoughtful donations-donations to causes, not necessarily to candidates with no chance of winning.

If you want to create choice, you are better off changing our voting system than you are by voting for a "spoiler." Your "spoiler vote" could help to defeat someone you yourself consider the best candidate with a real chance to win.

[FY 2025 ANNUAL ASSESSMENT RESOLUTION]

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE HARMONY WEST COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT MAKING A DETERMINATION OF BENEFIT AND IMPOSING SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024/2025; PROVIDING FOR THE COLLECTION AND ENFORCEMENT OF SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO PENALTIES AND INTEREST THEREON; CERTIFYING AN ASSESSMENT ROLL; PROVIDING FOR AMENDMENTS TO THE ASSESSMENT ROLL; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Harmony West Community Development District ("District") is a local unit of special-purpose government established pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, for the purpose of providing, operating and maintaining infrastructure improvements, facilities and services to the lands within the District; and

WHEREAS, the District has constructed or acquired various infrastructure improvements and provides certain services in accordance with the District's adopted capital improvement plan and Chapter 190, *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors ("Board") of the District has determined to undertake various operations and maintenance and other activities described in the District's budget ("Adopted Budget") for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2024 and ending September 30, 2025 ("Fiscal Year 2024/2025"), attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, in order to fund the District's Adopted Budget, the District's Board now desires to adopt this Resolution setting forth the means by which the District intends to fund its Adopted Budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE HARMONY WEST COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

1. FUNDING. As indicated in **Exhibits A and B,** the District's Board hereby authorizes the following funding mechanisms for the Adopted Budget:

a. OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE ASSESSMENTS.

i. Benefit Findings. The provision of the services, facilities, and operations as described in Exhibit A confers a special and peculiar benefit to the lands within the District, which benefit exceeds or equals the cost of the assessments. The allocation of the

- assessments to the specially benefitted lands is shown in **Exhibits A and B,** and is hereby found to be fair and reasonable.
- ii. Assessment Imposition. Pursuant to Chapters 190, 197 and/or 170, Florida Statutes, and using the procedures authorized by Florida law for the levy and collection of special assessments, a special assessment for operation and maintenance is hereby imposed and levied on benefitted lands within the District and in accordance with Exhibits A and B. The lien of the special assessments for operations and maintenance imposed and levied by this Resolution shall be effective upon passage of this Resolution.
- **iii. Maximum Rate.** Pursuant to Section 197.3632(4), *Florida Statutes*, the lien amount shall serve as the "maximum rate" authorized by law for operation and maintenance assessments.
- **b. DEBT SERVICE SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS.** The District's Board hereby directs District Staff to affect the collection of the previously levied debt service special assessments, as set forth in **Exhibits A and B.**

2. COLLECTION AND ENFORCEMENT; PENALTIES; INTEREST.

- a. Tax Roll Assessments. If and to the extent indicated in Exhibits A and B, certain of the operations and maintenance special assessments (if any) and/or previously levied debt service special assessments (if any) imposed on the "Tax Roll Property" identified in Exhibit B shall be collected at the same time and in the same manner as County taxes in accordance with Chapter 197 of the Florida Statutes. The District's Board finds and determines that such collection method is an efficient method of collection for the Tax Roll Property.
- b. Direct Bill Assessments. If and to the extent indicated in Exhibits A and B, certain operations and maintenance special assessments (if any) and/or previously levied debt service special assessments (if any) imposed on "Direct Collect Property" identified in Exhibit B shall be collected directly by the District in accordance with Florida law, as set forth in Exhibits A and B. The District's Board finds and determines that such collection method is an efficient method of collection for the Direct Collect Property.
 - i. Due Date (O&M Assessments) Operations and maintenance assessments directly collected by the District shall be due and payable on the dates set forth in the invoices prepared by the District Manager, but no earlier than October 1st and no later than September 30th of Fiscal Year 2024/2025.

- **ii.** Due Date (Debt Assessments) Debt service assessments directly collected by the District are due in full on December 1, 2024; provided, however, that, to the extent permitted by law, the assessments due may be paid in two partial, deferred payments and on dates that are 30 days prior to the District's corresponding debt service payment dates all as set forth in the invoice(s) prepared by the District Manager.
- iii. In the event that an assessment payment is not made in accordance with the schedule(s) stated above, the whole assessment – including any remaining partial, deferred payments for the Fiscal Year, shall immediately become due and payable; shall accrue interest, penalties in the amount of one percent (1%) per month, and all costs of collection and enforcement; and shall either be enforced pursuant to a foreclosure action, or, at the District's sole discretion, collected pursuant to the Uniform Method on a future tax bill, which amount may include penalties, interest, and costs of collection and enforcement. Any prejudgment interest on delinquent assessments shall accrue at the rate of any bonds secured by the assessments, or at the statutory prejudgment interest rate, as applicable. In the event an assessment subject to direct collection by the District shall be delinguent, the District Manager and District Counsel, without further authorization by the Board, may initiate foreclosure proceedings pursuant to Chapter 170, Florida Statutes, or other applicable law to collect and enforce the whole assessment, as set forth herein.
- c. **Future Collection Methods.** The decision to collect special assessments by any particular method e.g., on the tax roll or by direct bill does not mean that such method will be used to collect special assessments in future years, and the District reserves the right in its sole discretion to select collection methods in any given year, regardless of past practices.
- 3. **ASSESSMENT ROLL; AMENDMENTS.** The Assessment Roll, attached to this Resolution as **Exhibit "B,"** is hereby certified for collection. The District Manager shall keep apprised of all updates made to the County property roll by the Property Appraiser after the date of this Resolution, and shall amend the Assessment Roll in accordance with any such updates, for such time as authorized by Florida law, to the County property roll.
- 4. **SEVERABILITY.** The invalidity or unenforceability of any one or more provisions of this Resolution shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining portions of this Resolution, or any part thereof.

5. **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Resolution shall take effect upon the passage and adoption of this Resolution by the Board.

The parties agree that the Agreement is hereby amended to include the maintenance of an additional six ponds, as identified in Exhibit A ("Scope of Services"). As compensation for the Scope of Services described in this Amendment in addition to the maintenance outlined in the Agreement, the District agrees to pay the Contractor the amounts set forth in Exhibit A.
- 3. AFFIRMATION OF THE AGREEMENT; CONFLICTS. The District and the Contractor agree that nothing contained herein shall alter or amend the parties' rights and responsibilities under the Agreement, except to the extent set forth herein. The Agreement is hereby affirmed and continues to constitute a valid and binding agreement between the parties.
- 4. AUTHORIZATION. The execution of this Amendment has been duly authorized by the

appropriate body or official of the District and the Contractor, both the District and the Contractor have complied with all the requirements of law, and both the District and the Contractor have full power and authority to comply with the terms and provisions of this instrument.

5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Amendment shall be effective after execution by both the District and the Contractor.

Mr. Leet stated that Harmony CDD residents were surprised by the demolition of three bridges that provide access to some of the trails. He acknowledged that one bridge was old and in poor condition and needed to be removed but he believes the other two were structurally sound and should not have been removed; one had damage but he thinks it was repairable.

Mr. Leet recalled discussion at the January Harmony West CDD meeting, when demolition was approved, about the HROA no longer maintaining the bridges. He thinks that is untrue and stated that a HROA Board Member told him that the HROA Board found the specific terms and fixed recurring costs to be unfavorable and expected to negotiate the terms with the Harmony West CDD. He recalled mention at the January meeting that the HROA asked for an update but that the Harmony West CDD did not do so and, in his opinion "acted unilaterally" on the matter. He acquiesced that, as the owner of the bridges, the Harmony West CDD has the right to demolish the bridges but opined that it is not what a "good neighbor" should do.

Mr. Leet questioned what can be done if the maintenance costs are not affordable to the HROA and suggested that the Harmony CDD could pay the Harmony West CDD for shared maintenance of the trails, which are used by residents of both CDDs. He plans to discuss this possibility with the Harmony CDD Board Members and hopes that the Interlocal Agreement can be amended to specifically cover the Buck Lane wetlands, trails, bridges and open natural areas.

Mr. Leet asked the Harmony West CDD Board to consider this.

Mr. Tyree expressed his understanding that the three bridges were not structurally sound. He stated Harmony West CDD is willing to consider a joint venture to possibly reestablish the bridges and maintain the trails. Regarding Buck Lake, he stated there is already an Agreement in place, which he thinks is effective. He asked for the Harmony CDD's help to stop Harmony CDD residents from illegally hunting and from driving on Forestar's property with ATVs.
